This list includes links to FREE book-related things that we hope you enjoy. It includes links to:

- "Audiobooks" where you listen to a recording of the book being read out loud. "Audible" is a well-known make of audiobook but there are lots of others too.
- "e-books" (also known as e-reader books) which are electronic books that you read on your computer or your phone or on a Kindle device.
- Websites where you read the book directly from the book's website so you don't need to download it. For example, on some of these sites you can read a serialised book where a new episode of the story is released each day.
- Websites where famous authors read their books out loud to you and where authors and illustrators talk about their work and how they got started.
