Leadership Academy



S1 and S2 pupils were given the opportunity at the beginning of the year to apply to be part of take the Boclair Leadership Academy. Over the 2 year groups 95 pupils applied and were given a place on the programme. They signed up to be part of a group who would develop their leadership skills through increased responsibility across the school. At the centre of their learning experience is a key theme or 'mission' which pupils work towards within a conference style event. The focus has been on personal development, mental health awareness and introduction of leadership concepts.

The S1 and S2 pupils have completed two out of the four conference days which are structured around the four C's of leadership; Communication, Courage, Confidence and Courage. We asked pupils to share their experiences so far as part of the Leadership Academy, and here is their version of a Leadership blog:





Why did you apply to the leadership academy?

"I applied because I love to get involved with events around the school that I can help and be a part of! I also want to develop my skills further to become the best I can when I move on from high school in my years ahead!"



What advice would you pass on to your younger peers if they were thinking about applying to the leadership academy?

Also to respect people's rights and opinions."

Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the evening and having the opportunity to cook a meal with a family member. We even had time to taste test at the end of the session!




Boclair's "NXP Monarch" Racing Team



Boclair Academy's "NXP Monarch" Racing Team reached the national finals of the F1 in Schools competition.

The F1 in Schools initiative was developed to introduce students to STEM subjects in the most engaging way possible, through the creation of a miniature F1 car. It is an educational project, which was designed for teachers, informed by engineers, and endorsed by F1.





The national final is the culmination of an extensive series of regional finals which saw the top teams progress to the nationals. The national finals were a three-day event for the teams to showcase their work in designing, manufacturing, and branding miniature F1 cars; as well as racing them on a 20-metre racetrack. This year's event took place at the Magna Science Adventure Centre, in Rotherham during March 2024.



Throughout the challenge, the team had to raise sponsorship and manage their budgets to fund research, travel and accommodation. In addition to funding, sponsored such as Switch Digital supported the team with marketing and pitching support to help bring the team's hard work to life.

Judges Choice



For the event NXP Monarch had to create a pit display, prepare both an enterprise and engineering portfolio, complete a 10 minute presentation and race their car down the track. The event culminated with a nomination in the "judges choice" award and the 19th fastest car out of 60 teams.

With the NXP Monarch members being in 6th year and the team reaching the national finals competition after their 3rd regional finals. They will not have the opportunity to compete in the event next year. However, a number of the pupils plan on joining the "F1 student" equivalent at university next year.



Referee Course

Well done to our refereeing class who have successfully passed their Referee Exam and are now going through their registrations to be fully qualified referees. The pupils have refereed S1/2 and girls' games this year to gain extra experience!

Cross Country and Athletics

This year, Boclair academy has participated across a number of athletics events including the Scottish Schools Road Race, Swimming Championship and the Aquathlon.





A notable one being the Scottish Schools Cross Country Championships, 23 Pupils represented Boclair Academy. The pupils enthusiastically joined the race, embracing the challenge with determination and resilience as they navigated the course with spirit. Special mention to Ben M (S1) who was the highest placing Boclair pupil at 32nd out of 226 people.



Netball











Judging the Royal Society Young People's Book Prize for Science

Pupils voted for their favourite books and results were submitted to the Society. We are now waiting to find out if the other UK schools taking part in the judging process agree with our choice and vote our favourite book as the overall winner.

We have also started storytelling activities in the library. In the first session we investigated and talked about the sinking of the Titanic and discussed why the human race are so fascinated by disasters.





ITE Faraday STEM Challenge at Glasgow Science Centre

12 of our S1/2 pupils participated in a STEM challenge at the Glasgow Science Centre. Pupils were given the challenge of building a circuit and coming up with an idea to make our roads safer. One of our teams came up with the idea of bollards that raised out of the ground when traffic lights were red, to prevent cars from skipping red lights and causing accidents. The other team created an electric car charging station made from solar panels on our UK roads.

Both teams presented their fully functional circuits and ideas to a room full of people. They received excellent feedback from the judges and were a credit to Boclair Academy. A very impressive feat from all pupils involved. Well done!





S3 Book club

During S3 library book club, pupils took part in the Barrington Stoke's Young Editor's scheme where they read, commented on and edited 2 real manuscripts ("Echostar" by Melinda Salisbury and "A Sudden Storm" by Bali Rai). Our pupils' editing suggestions were submitted to the Barrington Stoke who considered them and implemented some of our suggested changed before the books were published so the input by our pupils helped shape the final form of these books



Senior Baristas - Keep Scotland Beautiful Training at Douglas Academy

Some of our talented senior barista pupils attended a 'Keep Scotland Beautiful' training at Douglas Academy in order to learn about sustainable practices when running a coffee. Pupils participated in activities and discussions alongside pupils from across East Dunbartonshire Council. S6 Mock Interview Programme

All of our S6 pupils were given the opportunity to participate in a 'Mock Interview' with a professional from their chosen career path. Pupils completed a questionnaire during PSE and learned how to answer classic interview questions during PSE in the lead up to their interviews taking place.

Around 15 professionals from different fields were invited to interview our pupils. The professionalism, preparation and confidence of our young people shone through and pupils received detailed feedback on their interviews. A massive well done to all pupils involved and a thank you again to all who gave up their time to come and hold interviews.







Young STEM Leader

A number of our S5 and S6 pupils are currently taking part in the 'Young STEM Leader' programme. This involves working as a team to create, risk assess and deliver activities to groups of younger pupils.

One group recently delivered a lesson to S1 pupils which involved analysing fingerprints to help solve a crime.

Young STEM Leaders were also a massive help at our P7 Open Evening earlier this year where they also created activities for families and Primary 7 pupils to enjoy. Pupils will continue to work on their Formal Level 6 qualifications which, when completed, will award them SCQF Credit points on their SQA certificates. you all!


Maths in STEM at BBC Scotland
