2. Minutes of last meeting

3. Matters arising

From AOCB regarding bins and littering, IG has investigated with the council. While there are enough bins in the grounds of Boclair Academy and the pupils are using the bins, with the Building Manager regularly emptying these 2 or 3 times a week and putting the contents in the larger bins which are thereafter uplifted by Waste,.

The main issue concerning litter is because of gulls pulling litter out of the bins. As a result, the council will look at fitting lids to the bins or increasing the number of times the bins are emptied to help reduce this issue. Discussion followed that lids may not be the answer as the bins have side openings. Also the littering is worst on the roads pupils use at lunchtimes away from the school / Inveroran Drive where there are very few bins.

Our STEM and Business challenges take place in February. Information is already being gathered on our new intake and enhanced transition will take place soon.

Further and Higher Education event

This Monday (27th January), Boclair Academy are holding a Further and Higher Education Information Evening in school from 6pm to 7.30 pm. The evening is aimed primarily at S4 and S5 pupils and their parents and carers, although pupils and parents / carers from S3 are also welcome to attend if they wish. There will be four presentations of around fifteen minutes. Presentations will give an overview of courses, faculties, entry procedures and requirements, university life and pathways to further and higher education. We will have speakers from The University of Glasgow, The University of Strathclyde and City of Glasgow College. In addition, two members of our school staff, Mr Martin (PT Guidance) and Ms Young (Skills Development Scotland) will present on UCAS applications, The Reach programme and Graduate apprenticeships. The evening will begin with a short introduction from a member of the senior leadership team before the four presentations start. Guests will be organised into four groups which will visit each presentation on a rotational basis.
