Dear Parent / Guardian

Welcome to our Spring edition of Boclair News. Yet again it has been a busy few weeks for our young people and staff and it is set to get busier over the coming weeks as we approach the exam period for senior pupils.

Perhaps our most important piece of news is the announcement of the proposal to build a new Boclair with a start date of July 2020. Parents, pupils and staff have worked well together to raise concerns about the current building and I am delighted with the support we have received from both elected members of the Council and Council Officers. I look forward to sharing more information on this exciting development as the plans begin to take shape.

At the start of January our Senior pupils undertook Preliminary Examinations across all subjects. While there were some disappointments for individuals the overall performance of the year groups involved was extremely positive. A lot of hard work is now required from all young people in S4, S5 and S6 in order to ensure they build on their current performance levels. Final presentation levels for all pupils in the senior phase have been issued to parents and I would encourage you to contact your child's guidance teacher if there are issues with the levels. I would also remind you that revision classes will run for most subjects on the first four mornings of the Spring Holiday.

It has also been a busy period for S3 pupils who have completed S3 assessments across their nine subjects in the lead up to course planning. At the same time they have been contributing well to the wider life of the school through extracurricular events and through their dementia friends work. Their energy levels, enthusiasm and commitment are to be commended at this busy time.

S2 pupils have also been focussing recently on important decisions on their courses for next year. We are delighted with the maturity and responsibility they have demonstrated during the various events organised to support them in their decision making. This is an ongoing process and parents can still discuss decisions about courses with the appropriate guidance teachers or Year Head. They have also continued to make excellent contributions to the wider community through their work with local food banks.

Our S1 cohort continues to contribute well to the life of Boclair Academy. Over the last few weeks they have been taking part in the first lessons of the S1 John Muir Project. We are very proud of the way in which this year group are developing and look forward to hearing of their continuing successes.

Our P7 transition programme continues to gather pace with a number of visits from Boclair staff already having taken place. Plans are in place to welcome P7 pupils to Boclair for a number of different activities over the next few months. We are all looking forward to welcoming them to their new school.

The articles included in this month's Boclair News provide a description of some of the various successes and events which have been part of Boclair Academy over the last few weeks. I hope you find the following information helpful and as ever we welcome your comments and new information which we can share in future newsletters.

I started as new librarian at Boclair Academy last November and am really enjoying getting to know all the Pupils and Staff here. Here are just a few of the recent events in the Library:

In our Readathon (pictures below) our S1s were sponsored to read by friends and family, with money raised going to local children's hospitals via the "Read for Good" charity. Many thanks to our S1 pupils from Mrs McGuire and me - we are incredibly proud of you for making the Readathon such a fun event and succeeding in your reading! Please hand in sponsor money to myself or Mrs McGuire by Friday March 29th and remember, the pupil collecting most sponsor money will receive a much sought after signed copy of "Infinity Drake" by John McNally!

We held a Scholastic Book fair in the Library and everyone from S1 through to S6 enjoyed buying books from our own wee bookshop. Pupils were sad to see the book fair leave and based on total book sales, we will receive book tokens back from Scholastic to buy more new books for the Library.



We have also been working towards fostering a reading environment across the school. Headed by Mrs McGuire, we are running a reading programme for our S1 pupils called "Accelerated Reading". Pupils read books from the Library that have been graded as appropriate for their stage in reading and, when finished, they take a short quiz to test their understanding. Results from these tests help us see how well pupils are progressing in reading. We are already seeing major improvements in pupils' reading abilities due to the programme.

S1s are also reading for at least 20 minutes a day by reading in registration and English, and we are grateful to busy parents and guardians for ensuring that pupils read at home every day too. Pupils who show the biggest increase in reading ability will be invited to a special Book Bistro in the library at the end of the year to celebrate their success in reading. Please remember to keep reading daily and see if you can be one of the lucky pupils invited to attend!

Lastly, please look out for the Reading Tree soon to appear in the Library. For every book and quiz you complete, you will get a leaf to put on the tree - if you score 100% in the test you will get a gold flower to put on the tree. 




New School Ties
